In doing so, He promises to bless our lives and make them prosper.

VISION

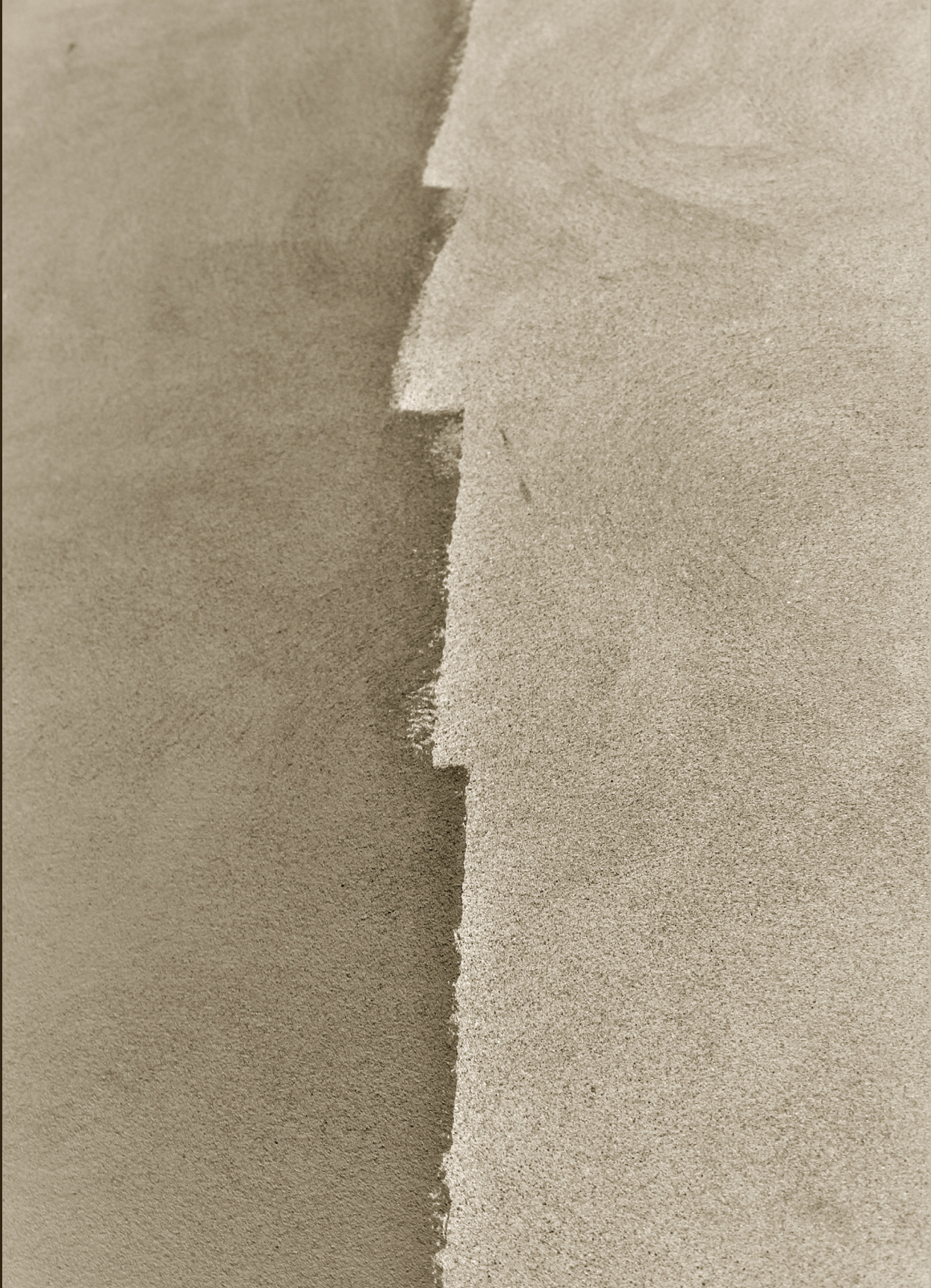
LEAVING LEGACY

REPENTANCE AND SURRENDER

Repentance and surrender are the foundation of fasting and prayer. Before we begin asking God for the things we want during the next 21 days, we should first seek His forgiveness of our sins. Psalm 66:18, says “If I had not confessed the sin in my heart, the Lord would not have listened.” Unconfessed sin hinders our prayers and can keep us from hearing God’s voice, so we must be sure that every sin in our lives is covered by the blood of Jesus. We can repent of every known sin, and as we fast, the Holy Spirit may reveal hidden sin, as well. Fasting often opens our eyes to the awareness of areas in us that need repentance. Allow the Holy Spirit to lead you to repentance and to receive forgiveness during these 21 days. Also, forgive anyone who has hurt or wounded you in any way.

In repentance, we are led to surrender. In fact, fasting is an act of surrender. It is a laying down of what we want and what we think we need. It’s laying down habits and indulgences to seek the Lord and His presence. It’s decreasing so He can increase in us. Christ has called us to live a “life” of surrender. To let go of our wants, desires, plans, ideas, opinions, facades, self-dependency, self-reliance, and self-sustenance to fully trust in Him, His Word, and His plan for us.

The Bible says in Proverbs 3:5-6, “Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him and He will direct your path.”

To fully surrender and trust the Lord is the path to experiencing God’s plan and purpose for our lives. The opposite of surrender is control. Control disguises itself as a strength, but it is actually weakness, stealing our true freedom. Control is driven by a fear of what will happen if we don’t control the outcome, and there is no freedom in fear. Real freedom is to have faith in and surrender to the One who made us and trust in His love and plan for our lives. This is where healing, deliverance, joy, peace, and rest are found. Repentance and Surrender form the foundation for experiencing everything God has for us during these next 21 days of fasting and prayer. Make this prayer personal and then take time to thank God for hearing and answering your prayers.

“Father, thank You for making provision for my deliverance and freedom from sin through the blood of Jesus. I confess all sin before You (specifically name) and I repent of my sins. I ask for Your forgiveness. Thank You for forgiving me, as I forgive all those who have hurt me in any way. I break and lose myself from every form of control, in Jesus Name and I surrender all that I am to You. Lord, produce in me the power of faith and trust in Your Word, as I surrender. I commit the next 21 days to making room for You in my life. In Jesus’ name, I pray. Amen.”



TUESDAY | JANUARY 9

ATTRIBUTES OF A WATCHMAN

Throughout the Bible, the watchman stands as a keeper of the gates, a symbol of attentiveness, responsibility, and spiritual discernment. As believers, we must take it personal to become a watchman. Every watchman is called to be:

1. Alert and Ready:

"So then let us not sleep, as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober." 1 Thessalonians 5:6 ESV

A watchman must be alert, and keenly aware of the signs around Him. We are called to be watchful, ready to discern what is taking place in the spirit and in the Earth. Our hearts should remain attentive to the voice of the Holy Spirit, guarding ourselves from being lulled to sleep.

2. Prayerful:

"So you, son of man, I have made a watchman for the house of Israel. Whenever you hear a word from my mouth, you shall give them warning from me." Ezekiel 33:7 ESV

The watchman in Ezekiel was tasked with sounding the alarm and warning the people of impending danger. As believers, we are called to the place of prayer, earnestly seeking God's guidance. Through prayer, we tune our ears so that we might hear the word of the Lord and be aware of things to come.

3. Unwavering:

"On your walls, O Jerusalem, I have set watchmen; all the day and all the night they shall never be silent. You who put the Lord in remembrance, take no rest." Isaiah 62:6 ESV

Watchmen were appointed to be vigilant day and night. As believers, our faithfulness to God's call should be unwavering, day and night. There are no breaks. We are called to be unwavering in our role as a watchman, having a resolute determination to stand guard over the gates of our lives, homes, and communities day and night.

"Father, thank you for making me a watchman. I ask that you help me stay alert and ready. Speak to me in the place of prayer. Give me endurance that I might always remain watchful on the wall. Thank you Holy Spirit for making me what I ought to be, to be a watchman on the wall. In Jesus' name, I pray. Amen."

The heart is more than just an organ in our body, it is a spiritual and divine place. It is more than a physical location where blood is pumped throughout the body, it is a sacred space where we process emotions, make determinations, communicate and commune with God.

You can see that matters concerning the heart are no joke! Our hearts determine so much of what we say and do (see Luke 6:45). If the heart plays this kind of role in the healthy functioning of our lives and our faith then certainly we must pay close attention and watch over our hearts.

Proverbs 4:23 says that we are to guard our hearts above all else, for it determines the course of our lives. When King Solomon penned this verse through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, guarding the heart above all else was more than a spiritual suggestion, it was a definitive command.

As a watchman, we must be committed to guarding (or watching) our hearts. We must prioritize the protection of our heart, and be devoted to keeping it pliable, clean, and sensitive to God so that we are able to retain every holy deposit made by God, His spirit, and His Word. We must be willing to discern and cast away anything that the enemy may send that would pollute, contaminate, or even break our hearts.

The real question is this then...how do we watch over and guard our hearts? I believe Philippians 4:6-7 gives us the solution. In that scripture, Paul says that by becoming and being a person

of constant prayer and supplication (asking or pleading humbly) with thanksgiving that God provides, employs, and deploys HIS PEACE to guard our hearts! Yes, you read that right...God's body guard for the heart is the soldier of his PERFECT PEACE! In essence, Paul is saying if you'll guard and be mindful of God's peace, God's peace will guard your heart.

So often the enemy's first wave of attack is against our peace. He knows that if he can get our peace he can have our hearts. But here's the power. When you pray this way, God doesn't promise a greater dose of our peace. He promises to give us HIS PEACE. And his peace is undefeated when it comes to guarding your heart. What a gift to every watchman.

In this year of the watchman don't fight for peace, pray to God. Consult Him, trust Him, lean on Him, worship Him and He will send perfect peace to help you guard your heart. And if the heart is on guard then the perfect plan of God will prevail in your life in every way!

"God, Today I seek You. I come to You. I depend and lean on You. I ask that You send Your peace to help guard my heart so that the contents of my heart may be pleasing, holy, and dedicated to You! In Jesus' name, I pray. Amen."

WATCHMAN OVER MY MIND

When it comes to being a watchman over our mind, we need to know first that our mind is the battlefield. The enemy loves to plague our minds with doubt, lies, insecurities, pride, and so much more. His goal is to infiltrate our minds because he knows if he can, we won't think clearly about ourselves or God. The scripture refers to the devil as "The Father of lies," so anytime the enemy speaks, he can't help but lie. One of his tactics is to plant a lie in our mind so that by continuing to think about it, the lie becomes so real to us that it eventually becomes our perceived reality. He might plant a lie in your mind and tell you that you're not beautiful and by thinking about that lie, insecurity begins to sprout, and now you hate the way you look. If you believe a lie, it'll eventually become your perceived reality!

That was the reality that the prophet Elijah was living in. Elijah had done great things in his life for God, but in this story, he wasn't doing a great thing; he was running. What happened is when Jezebel sent a messenger to Elijah, he didn't just read the message, but he dwelt on it. Whenever we dwell on messages from the enemy, we create a dwelling place for Him in our mind. So how do we stop the enemy from trying to make our mind go crazy? Anytime he speaks those lies to us, we leave Him on read! Whenever you leave someone on "read," that means you just read the message with no intention of responding.

If he tells us that we are not good enough, not beautiful, not worthy, not gifted, you leave that devil on read! The scripture tells us to resist the devil, and he will flee (James 4:7).

"Lord, I pray right now that You begin to uproot any lie that I have been believing, and I pray as You do that, You would replace every lie with Your truth. Thank You for Your Word because it's Your Word that renews my mind, so I pray that as I continue to read Your Word, my mind would be renewed. In Jesus' name, I pray. Amen."

WATCHMAN OVER MY WORSHIP

As watchmen over our worship, we have decided that our worship belongs to God, and God alone! We are declaring our refusal to bow down to anything other than Christ, and we will stand in opposition to anything that would seek to challenge this resolve.

One of the primary functions of a watchman in scripture was to guard against dangers; moreover, they were expected to see and recognize even the potential dangers long before they approached. It seems to me that this was a job that required intentionality and focus. What we don't guard against, we will eventually give way to.

The watchman in our opening scripture, “spied” the company of Jehu. A spy is a person who secretly collects and reports information on the activities, movements, and plans of an enemy. I believe one of the greatest defenses against the threat of the enemy is our time in the “secret” place. This is where we lay our lives before the Lord, pray, and seek His face, but it's also where He reveals the hidden things within our hearts (motives, affections, desires, distractions), and exposes things that pose potential harm to our purpose or pull us away from the very object of our worship; The Lord Himself.

David says in Psalm 139:23-24 “Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. Point out anything in me that offends you and leads me along the path of everlasting life.”

That's the prayer of a worshiper. It's about keeping your heart postured in the right place. You see, there's a reason I haven't

mentioned singing, dancing, giving, or attending a church service. It's because though they are all part of worship, it goes much deeper than that. A worshiper is someone who is fully devoted to God; honoring Him above everything else. This is what makes our singing, dancing, giving, and gathering attractive to The Lord. The fragrance of adoration is appealing to the King. That's why the enemy wants to keep you distracted. Because He knows that if you are hidden in the presence of God, there's nothing he can do to stop you!

Just like the Word says in Psalm 18:2, “The Lord is my rock, and my fortress, and my deliverer; my God, my strength, in whom I trust; my buckler, and the horn of my salvation, and my high tower.”

Did you see that?! The word “tower” in this verse means “high place”, beyond the reach of danger. So as we prioritize the presence of God and worshiping Him, we are protecting ourselves from threats both seen and unseen. This doesn't mean that we won't have trouble, but it means we are covered even in the midst of it. Worshiping God keeps us in the “high place” beyond the enemy's reach. We can see his schemes and snares long before they come, not because we're smart, but because our Father reveals secrets in the secret place.

“Heavenly Father, I commit to prioritizing your presence this year. I submit myself to worshiping You, and You alone. Keep my heart close to You and teach me to guard against the enemies of my pursuit. In Jesus' name, I pray. Amen.”


